More than \$100 Thousand Available for Selected Projects

SANTA FE, NM -- The New Mexico State Forestry Division's Urban and Community Forestry Program is requesting proposals to fund urban and community forestry projects across the state, according to State Urban and Community Forestry Program Manager Jennifer Dann.

Funding is available for distribution among all approved projects and plans under multiple contracts as a result of this Request for Proposals (RFP). The community forestry assistance program is designed to specifically support healthy community forests in New Mexico.
