## Eagle Nest Lake State Park Closed to Boating

**Eagle Nest, NM** – Eagle Nest Lake is closed to boating and ice-fishing due to recent weather conditions that have led to unsafe lake conditions. The lake is currently closed to all watercraft including canoes, kayaks, inflatables, and all types of motorboats. A layer of ice has formed over portions of the lake, but not in the condition necessary to facilitate ice fishing. Park staff will continue monitoring ice conditions and will advise when the lake is safe for ice fishing.
