Seven Rivers Day Use Area Re-Opened at Brantley Lake State Park

Carlsbad, NM – The Seven Rivers Day Use Area at Brantley Lake State Park is now open after an extended off-season closure.

“Brantley Lake State Park is open and ready for visitors,” said State Parks Director Tommy Mutz. “Visitors will be able to enjoy the Seven Rivers Day Use Area with its boat ramp, and shoreline access for day use and camping.”

The Limestone Campground and Eastside Day Use Area are open as well. Brantley Lake State Park has two open boat ramps available for great boating and fishing opportunities.

“Due to the heavy rains last September, the water level at all of the lakes on the Pecos River is great for boating,” said Southeast Regional Manager Alan Fiala. “Register your boat, get your safety supplies, and head out to the lake to enjoy the high water levels.”
