Cerrillos Hills State Park Public Meeting Scheduled

Cerrillos, NM – New Mexico State Parks invites citizens to a public meeting to comment on the draft park management plan for Cerrillos Hills State Park. The plan includes a review of existing park resources and proposes improvements for the next five years.

The public meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, July 1, 2014, from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm at the Cerrillos Hills State Park visitor center, 37 Main St., Cerrillos, NM. Verbal comments on the draft plan will be accepted at the public meeting. Anyone interested in providing written comments may do so no later than July 7, 2014, by submitting them to:

The plan proposes a variety of improvements to Cerrillos Hills State Park. Recommendations include expanding the trail system, upgrading the parking area, and creating and implementing a design for the vacant lot next to the visitor center.

Each state park is required to have a current park management plan. The objective is to provide direction for the management and development of the park to protect park resources and enhance recreational opportunities.
